"Shipwreck on Malta" | Devotion on Acts 27

o Apostle Paul stands apart from the giants of the Christian faith.

o Himself a rabbi and a Roman citizen, strict Pharisees adhering to the Law, and fierce persecutor of early Christians. He was present when Stephen was stoned to death.

- o Saw the risen Lord on the road to Damascus, the one who he persecuted. See Acts 9
- o The Lord converted him, and chose him to preach salvation to the gentiles
- o Paul wrote the majority of Epistles to the churches.
- o He penned the core doctrines of the Christian faith
- o His life adventures read like pages from the "Indiana Jones" novels, see 2 Corinthians 11:24-27
- o His final years were climax tic see Acts 27-28
 - 1. Shipwreck at Malta Acts 27
 - 2. Ministry on Malta Acts 28:1-10 (See similarity of how native Indians cared for the early Pilgrims)
 - 3. House prison in Roman Acts 28:11-31

o Luke's record of the shipwreck is scientifically and nautically accurate. Acts 27:9-37

- 1. Scholars triangulate the location at "St. Paul's island", off from the tip of Malta.
- 2. See "Apostle Paul's Shipwreck-An Historical Examination of Acts 27 and 28" by Jefferson White

o As we read 27:9-37, please list the time, duration, places, distances, weather, directions they are heading.

- 1. Time was after Fasting day of atonement, and before winter
- 2. Very descriptive of the areas. Look like the writer knows about sea faring
- 3. Very descriptive of vessels
- 4. Details of what they do leaving no doubt this is a true event
- 5. 276 people on board the last grain ship without food for 14 days
- 6. Ranging storms
- 7. Neither sun nor stars for many days
- o What were the physical, emotional and spiritual conditions of the people?
 - 1. Without food due to toss of cargo overboard
 - 2. Sea sick in a fierce storms
 - 3. Lost hope in total despair
 - 4. Even worst, the sailors decide to abandon ship
 - 5. Hungry, cold, sea sick, vomiting, wet
 - 6. Paul not young any more
 - 7. In panic mode
- o Where do you see Practical Christianity practiced?
 - 1. Paul gave the warning v9-10

- 2. Paul bring them encouragement 1) promise from God v23, &24, 2) Faith in God v. 25
- 3. Paul steps in as the man of God bringing in hope and salvation
- 4. Paul urged them to eat
- 5. Give thanks in front of the people, and eat He displays calmness and faith in God that life will be preserved
- 6. People are encouraged and follow Paul to eat before last dash for their life

o How do you see Romans 8:28 & 35 fulfilled in these verses?

- 1. 28 And we know that all things work together for good to them that love God, to them who are the called according to his purpose.
- 2. The story did not end in disaster, but end in glory when Paul ministered at Malta. Without the shipwreck, gospel will not be brought to Malta.
- 3. 250 witnessed the salvation of the Lord
- 4. Had Paul was not on board the ship, the ship would still run aground, and all lives will be lost.
- 5. Since Paul was a prisoner under the care of the centurion, his advice was able to reach the captain.

o 35 Who shall separate us from the love of Christ? shall tribulation, or distress, or persecution, or famine, or nakedness, or peril, or sword

- 1. Paul did not desert Christ in dangerous moments
- 2. Paul glorified God more
- 3. His love for Christ compelled him to stick with the group
- 4. God will Paul to reach Rome alive. Nothing can frustrate His plan.
