## **Devotion Notes**

Mike Ho gives the devotion on "Repent or Else" from Luke 13:1-9 on Nov 5, 2010

- Some self-righteous reporters assumed the Galileans go what they deserved. But, Jesus brought
  another example to tell them in both cases the victims of these tragedies were not especially
  evil.
- Jesus led their focus of their eternal destiny. Unless they repent they too will perish.
- Then, Jesus used a parable to illustrate what he meant.
- When I grew the fig tree, I got some fruit in the first year. Here, this fig tree had been there for 3 years, but still no fruit. The vineyard symbolizes the nation of Israel. Fig tree was to symbolize Jews.
- Jesus had been with them for 3 years, yet they have not accepted His message, to repent and acknowledge Jesus is the Messiah.
- The man asked for one more year to give it another chance. So, God is patient and forbearing,
  He gives more chances for people to repent. But there is a time for judgment. People have to
  repent or be doomed.
- Questions:
  - 1. When we know anyone who still has not repented, We should petition and earnestly pray for God to provide one more chance. Pray for "one more year", "2<sup>nd</sup> chance" showing Psalm 103:8-13
  - 2. "dig around & fertilize" our effort must be relentless and don't give up.
  - 3. What will happen if they die today? the consequence is clear. If he has repented, he will perish.
  - 4. Do we love them enough to do what we could to tell them the good news?
  - 5. From "barren" to fruit, God is looking for a sign of change in life. This person has a chance.
  - 6. God's patience will run out when we keep resisting. "if not, then cut it down."
